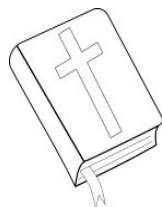

### TROCAIRE APPEAL for Famine in East Africa—

**Saturday 23rd & Sunday 24th July.** If you could give a little extra on the plate. Many thanks in advance.

In Somalia, Ethiopia and Kenya, famine is emerging due to failure of the seasonal rains over the past two years. Now more than 12 million are at serious risk, over half of them children. People are now being forced to move from their homes, endure serious levels of malnutrition at five times the emergency threshold, and to sell their livestock which is their most important asset. The situation is steadily worsening and the town of Dollow on the Somali/Ethiopia border is a case in point. There are 1,700 Somalis crossing into Ethiopia daily. Trocaire runs a health centre for mothers and their children in Dollow which provides outpatient care, antenatal and delivery care, child screening, vaccination services and additional outreach programmes to 5 outlying villages. Trocaire also runs an outpatient therapeutic feeding programme for severely malnourished children which has been in place for a number of years but has had to scale up to cope with the current crisis. **On behalf of the people of East Africa calling out in distress for our assistance, we thank you sincerely for your ongoing support of Trocaire's work. If you can, please put a little extra on the plate this weekend.**
